Banjul American International School (BAIS) was founded in 1984. It is an independent, coeducational day school for English-speaking students of all nationalities from Pre-Kindergarten (age 2+) through Grade 12 (age 18). The school's supportive learning environment and caring, creative teachers instill confidence, compassion, open-mindedness and critical thinking in every student. The school year extends from late August/ early September to mid/late June with approximately 180 days of instruction. Official Gambian holidays are recognized, and long breaks are taken for the December/New Year and spring break.

Organization: The Board of Directors consists of 6 members, each serving a 2-year term. The BAIS Association (parents/guardians and teachers) elects five (5) board members, and one (1) member is appointed by the U.S. Embassy.

Curriculum: BAIS is fully accredited by the Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools (MSA), USA. Instruction is in English. The core subjects: English, mathematics, science, and social studies, are supplemented with specialty instruction in art, French, technology, music and physical education. The curriculum from Kindergarten through 12th grade is aligned with AERO standards (including NGSS standards for Science), and the Pre-K curriculum aligns with the New York State Early Learning Guidelines.

All units develop the international understanding of students, including knowledge of Gambian and African cultures. The school follows ISTE standards for technology instruction and NASPE standards for physical education. Technology is integrated with learning across the subjects, and all classes have dedicated time in the computer lab and library each week.

BAIS opened a **full High School program in September 2020** to allow students in The Gambia to complete the 4-year American high school program and earn a U.S. High School Diploma without having to leave the country. (Prior to this time, BAIS supported students in high school via individual UNHS online classes.) The high school program opened a full Grade 9 class in 2020-21 and will add one additional grade level each year. 2021-22 will see at least one student in Grade 12, two in Grade 11, and full classes in Grade 9 and 10.

Advanced Placement (AP) classes are offered in future for individual students prepared to tackle more challenging academic courses. Self-paying families with students in grades 9-12 are encouraged to join and offered a specially discounted tuition rate as the BAIS high school program is grown.

BAIS is an incredibly **nurturing** school with high levels of individualized attention and strong Personal, Social, Emotional Learning (PSEL) and Service Learning programs. Three eight-week sessions of after-school activities are offered to all students in Kindergarten and up, including a variety of artistic,

athletic, and academic activities, and a BAIS highlight is the annual musical with a role for every student in the school! The Service Learning program aligns with UN Sustainable Development Goals and focuses on a different SDG goal each year. The goal is for students in PK through Grade 12 to apply learning through action that will improve their community.

Faculty: The faculty consists of 7 full-time teachers (5 U.S. citizens, 1 Gambian and 1 third-country national) and 4 part-time teachers (2 U.S. citizens, 1 Gambian and 1 third-country national). BAIS teachers have Bachelor's or Master's degrees and internationally recognized teaching credentials.

Enrollment: At the start of the third trimester, enrollment is 67 students, including 18 U.S. citizens, 34 third-country nationals, and 15 host-country nationals. Of the U.S. enrollment, 4 students are dependents of U.S. government direct-hire or contract employees, and 14 are dependents of private U.S. citizens, 6 with dual Gambian/US citizenship.

Facilities: The campus consists of four main buildings which serve as 'bookends' to the outdoor recreation area, soccer field and basketball court. At the front of the campus, the administrative building contains the reception office, director's office, library, computer lab, teacher collaboration areas and safe haven 1. The elementary building houses grades K, 1, 2, 3, 4 and Music classes. At the other end of campus, families and visitors enter between the middle school/high school wing with its science lab, humanities and math rooms and the Early Childhood building which houses PK, Art and French classrooms. The outdoor areas include field space for soccer and ultimate Frisbee, a basketball court, playground equipment and grass volleyball courts as well as a dedicated, outdoor Discovery Learning area for PK.

Finances: Approximately 87% of the school's income comes from tuition and fees. Annual tuition rates for 2021-22 are: PK1-2: \$6,257 half-day and \$8,230 full-day; KG-grade 5: \$20,446; grades 6-8: \$23,433; and grades 9-12: \$25,287. The same tuition fee covers the cost of after-school activities, school social events, the yearbook, and other student activities.

A \$200 application fee and a one-time only nonrefundable school development fee of \$4,500 for all new students are payable upon enrollment. (All fees are quoted in U.S. dollars.) A hot lunch service is available from an outside provider for an additional cost.

Uniforms: BAIS polo shirts are available, but no uniform is required.
