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SERVING ALL STUDENTS

WHAT DOES SPECIAL POPULATIONS LOOK LIKE AT EXPLORE SCHOOLS?

Nearly 20% of our students receive special education services. We believe that Special Education is not a child, a place, or label. Rather, special education is specially designed instruction and supports to ensure that every student receives empowering support services and accommodations to meet their academic goals.

SPECIAL EDUCATION AND ELL SERVICES PROVIDED:

- Explore Schools provides English as a New Language (ENL) services to all students who are identified through the typical statewide M/ ELL universal identification process as well as an internal identification process.
- In both cases, students receive ENL services based on their proficiency level, as prescribed by city regulations and as measured by the WIDA.
- A combination of ICT and SETSS services is the most common IEP program at our network.
- Counseling is also provided at each of our eight schools by full-time social workers and counselors. Additionally, all of our schools offer Related Services such as Speech Therapy, Occupational Therapy, Physical Therapy, Hearing Education Services, and placement Paraprofessionals for qualifying students.
- 3 of our campuses have 12:1:1 classes to provide a smaller student to teacher ratio to our highest need scholars.

SPECIAL EDUCATION ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

- We value school and network-level special populations leaders:
 - **Senior Director of Special Populations (network level)** Primarily responsible for providing our Special Populations Coordinators (SPCs) with guidance on compliance, effective pedagogy, and charged with the professional development of school-based special populations staff.
 - School Based Special Populations Leaders (Coordinators/Directors) Coordinate all services and instruction for all students served through our special populations programming, including students with Individualized Education Programs (IEPs), students who are classified as English Language Learners (ELLs), and students who may benefit from additional interventions and supports.
- We offer a range of settings and services to support the needs and learning of all students:
 - English as a New Language (ENL) instruction by ENL Learning Specialists
 - Special Education Teacher Support Services (SETSS) in small groups by Learning Specialists
 Integrated Co-teaching (ICT) classes with a special education teacher and general education
 teacher
 - o 12:1:1 classes taught by a special education teacher and assistant teacher
 - Small group instruction periods to provide intervention in reading and math
- How do special populations educators collaborate with general education teachers?
 - There are many opportunities for our special populations educators to collaborate with general education teachers to align on the fundamentals of strong instruction, analyze and discuss student progress data, and plan instruction.
 - These opportunities include: professional development sessions throughout the year, regular Response to Intervention (RTI) meetings, Professional Learning Community (PLCs) meetings and common prep periods.
